

Olive Palomino Buzzer

A good fly to try when trout wise-up and the going gets tough.

Also try Black, Orange, Red and Yellow bodies.



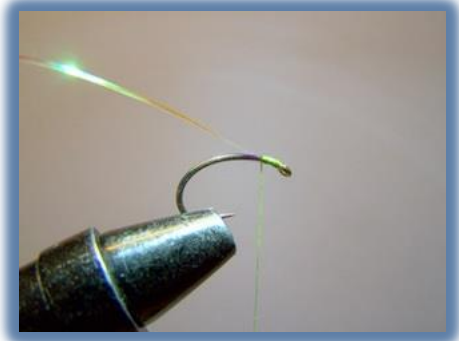
Dressing

Hook	Buzzer or Grub hook size 10-14 Kamasan B100/B110 Tiemco 2457 Lathkill 31165	Detached Body	Olive micro chenille (single point with lighter)
Thread	Olive	Thorax	Olive Glister / Litebrite / Orvis hares ear ice dub /seals fur
Body	Pearl Lurex / holographic tinsel half of hook shank or quarter of hook shank if tied short	Hackle	Olive Hen hackle – if required
		Head	tying thread, whip finish and varnish.



Step 1

Secure hook in vice (ping it) and catch on tying thread and remove excess.



Step 2

Catch in pearl Lurex or holographic tinsel and bind it to hook shank with tying thread - half way down or quarter way if tied short.

Step 3

Wind tying thread back up hook shank to eye. Coat with thin coat of varnish or super glue and wind lurex, in overlapping turns in opposite direction to thread, back up to eye. Secure and trim waste.

Step 4

Prepare chenille body by pulling the chenille fibres from the binding thread and singe the opposite end with flame using a cigarette lighter.



Step 5

Catch chenille onto on to the hook shank in the thorax area and secure.

Step 6

Dub glister / Litebrite / ice dub onto tying thread.

Step 7

Wind the dubbing around the hook shank to form thorax and secure.

(For hackle version - see Step 9)

Step 8

To finish, create neat head, whip finish and varnish head.

If Hackle Required



Step 9 - from Step 7

Prepare olive hen hackle and catch in, secure and remove excess.



Wind 3 to 4 turns of hen hackle around hook shank, secure, trim waste.

Form neat head, whip finish and varnish head



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
